#### Co-Player

#### Alex Stamchev • Auburn Senior • Pleven, Bulgaria

- Broke the Auburn career doubles wins record on Jan. 30 vs. North Carolina as he teamed with sophomore Daniel Cochrane for the clinching point at No. 1 doubles.
- He now has 97 career doubles wins, one more than Auburn great Stephen Huss (2005 Wimbledon doubles champion).
- Provided the clinching singles win vs. UNC to propel Tigers into the ITA National Team Indoor Championships for the first time in program history.
- Has an 11-3 overall singles record and 14-2 doubles record this season.
- Is 9-1 in doubles with Cochrane, 5-1 with Mies.

#### Eric Quigley • Kentucky Senior • Pewee Valley, Ky.

- Singles win against ECU set the school record for singles wins in a career with 145, passing the legendary Paul Varga, whose record has stood for over 27 years.
- Is now the winningest singles player in school history with a 147-44 record.
- Went 4-0 on the week in singles with three straight-set wins.
- Helped Kentucky defeat three top-60 teams and two top-30 teams on the week.
- Earned a singles point vs. Tulsa which helped UK advance to its third consecutive ITA National Indoor Championships.
- Went 2-1 in doubles action, helping Kentucky earn the doubles point against IU and NC State.
- Lone doubles loss came against the No. 3 ranked duo in the nation from Tulsa.

- Provided critical wins at the top of the singles and doubles lineups to lead the Vols to two wins in the ITA Kick-Off Weekend to clinch a spot in the ITA National Team Indoors for the fourth straight year.
- He is the only Vol with more than 10 wins in both singles & doubles (12-2 in singles, 13-3 in doubles) this season.
- He has started his dual match career 4-1 at the top of both lineups.
- Against Ole Miss, the freshman duo of Libietis/Reese defeated the Thiemann twins 8-3 at No. 1 doubles. The Thiemanns won the SEC Indoor Championships earlier this month.
- Libietis then beat Nik Schroeder in three sets to tie the match 3-3 in the Vols' victory.

- Walters earned two singles wins and two doubles wins over the weekend against Iowa and a ranked DePaul team.
- His two singles wins keeps his streak alive at five straight matches dating back to the fall season.
- His win against Kasper was his tenth win of the year and moves him to 10-2 on the year with a perfect 4-0 dual match record.
- In doubles, he and Hall Fess have been dominate in winning 11 of their first 12 matches this year.

### **Player**

**Bob van Overbeek • Florida**

**Junior • Boca Raton, Fla.**

- Turned in an impressive performance over the weekend, notching four victories and his first-ever win over a top-five singles opponent.
- On Saturday, he teamed with Andrew Butz to win the first doubles match, 8-5, against No. 32 Florida State and help UF take the doubles point.
- He then earned a straight-set win at No. 1 singles over FSU's Jordan Kelly-Houston, 6-3, 7-6 (6), to give Florida a 3-0 lead in the match, which it went on to win 6-1.
- On Sunday, after UF split the doubles matches on the top two courts, Butz and van Overbeek's match became crucial. They had fallen behind 4-2 to the Fighting Illini, but reeled off six-straight games to win the match and take the doubles point for the Gators.
- In singles going up against No. 2-ranked Nevolo, he pulled out a tiebreaker in the first set to gain the advantage, but fell behind 3-1 early in the second set. He then broke Nevolo twice and held serve twice to take a 5-3 lead and things looked promising. Nevolo won his final service game, but van Overbeek followed with a big service game of his own to end the match, 7-6 (5), 6-4, earning his first-ever victory over a top-5 opponent. Florida ultimately won the match 6-1.

### Player

**Anthony Rossi • Kentucky  
Junior • Marseille, France**

- Highlighted Kentucky's weekend at the ITA National Men's Indoor Championships, going 3-0 in singles action and defeating a ranked foe in doubles action to lift UK to the quarterfinals of the event for the first time since 1997.
- Has won a career-best 16 consecutive matches dating back to his singles title at the SEC Coaches' Indoor Championships.
- Was the highlight of UK's match vs. No. 9 Stanford, posting an impressive 6-4, 6-4 win over Bradley Klahn, who is a two-time singles All-American and the 2010 NCAA Singles champion.
- Is currently ranked 13th in the nation in singles, a career high.
- The native of Marseille, France is now 26-2 on the season for Kentucky, and 9-0 in dual matches.
- Performed well in doubles with Tom Jomby, defeating No. 36 Lewis and Hoover of Texas A&M 9-7.
- Played a tough match against a top-30 ranked doubles team from Ohio State.

- Helped Georgia to a 3-1 week by going a combined 5-0, including three singles victories at the ITA National Indoors to improve his dual match record to a perfect 7-0.
- His wins vs. Cal and Florida in the first round and quarterfinal matches were both clinches, while he also won vs. top-ranked Southern Cal in Sunday's semifinal, a win that at the time evened the team score at 1-1 and was his second career victory over a ranked opponent.
- In doubles vs. Georgia Tech last Tuesday, Pasha's win with Ignacio Taboada was the clinching decision in giving the Bulldogs the early point on their way to a 7-0 shutout of their in-state rival, while he and Taboada also picked up wins in doubles in both the Cal and UF matches to improve to 5-0 on the season and 4-0 in duals.

### Player

**Artem Ilyushin • Mississippi State

- Ilyushin is now on a three-match win streak, all coming against opponents ranked in the top-35 including, then ranked #27 Marcel Theimann of Ole Miss, No. 34 James Meredith of Boise State and Texas Tech's 33rd-ranked Gonzalo Escobar.
- In the Blue/Gray Classic this weekend, Ilyushin was part of an MSU team that gave up only two sets in 18 singles matches played.

- Won his 100th career doubles match in Friday's win over Arkansas as the 16th-ranked duo of Stamchev and Andreas Mies defeated Arkansas' Hall Fess and Matt Walters, 8-1.

- Earned his 100th career singles win on Sunday with a 6-4, 6-2 win over LSU's Neal Skupski at the No. 2 position.

- Stamchev moved into second place all-time in Auburn singles wins.

- He is now six wins shy of the all-time Auburn record for combined singles/doubles wins (207).

- Has a 14-2 record in singles in dual-match play (4-0 SEC) and is currently on a seven-match winning streak.

- Increased his dual-match record to 20-1, including a 10-0 mark against SEC foes.
- Both wins helped Kentucky move to 10-0 on the season in SEC play, clinching at least a share of the SEC regular-season championship for the first time since 1992.
- Started the week with an impressive three-set win over No. 15 Artem Ilyushin of Mississippi State.
- Concluded the weekend with a come-from-behind win over No. 19 Nik Scholtz of Ole Miss.
- With Kentucky leading the match 3-1, Quigley and Scholtz entered a critical third set. Quigley began the set with a break to take an early lead before earning another break at 4-2 and then holding serve to grab the 6-2 win and clinch the team win for Kentucky.
- Has won six consecutive matches this season, including five against opponents currently ranked in the top 42.
- Has defeated 12 players this spring that are currently ranked in the ITA singles rankings.
